HAVING FUN, ORRIE?

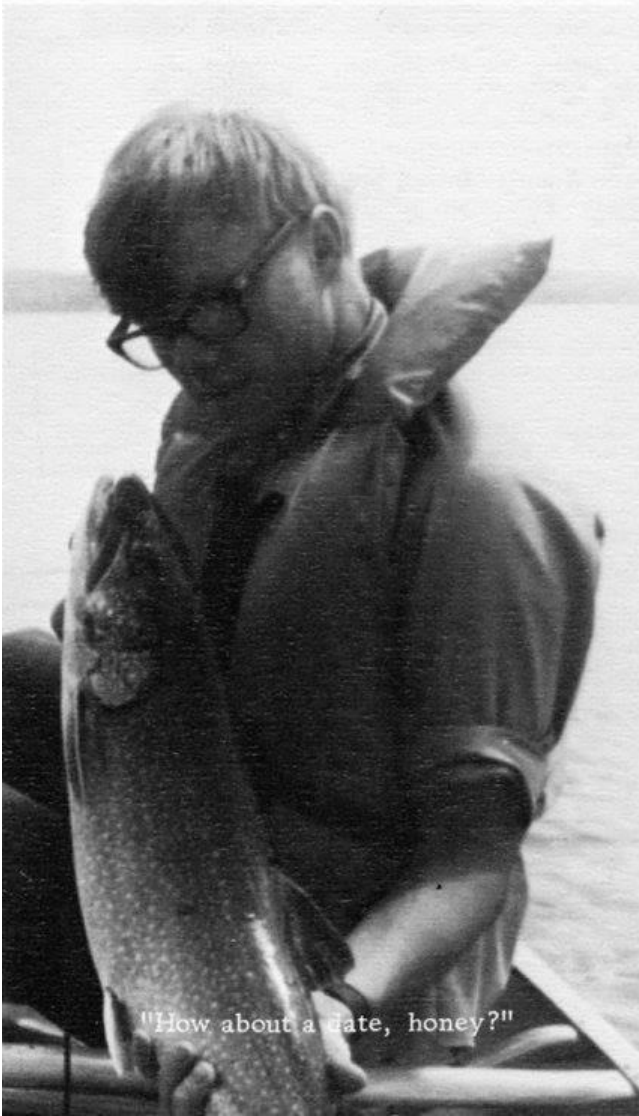
Last year Katahdin High was the only school in all of New England to win an environmental award from President Nixon. The ECP I (Environmental Control Project I) boys were given instruction by various state agencies in the potential and responsibilities of the people working to protect the environment. Bud Jeffrey, director of Maine National Mattagamon Boy Scout Wilderness Base topped off the year with a week long high adventure trip for the seventeen boys, Mr. Crandall, and Mr. O'Connor.

This school year offered two ECP groups with the novices and veterans getting classroom instruction at the Molunkus Fish and Game Clubhouse in Sherman. In addition to the Boy Scout Wilderness Base, the Maine Forest Service, Maine Inland Fisheries and Game, Baxter Park Authority, Allagash Wilderness Waterway Commission, Great Northern Paper Company, and the Environmental Improvement Commission are all participating. The purpose of the program is to expose the students to potential jobs that are available locally in the area of environmental protection, and to give them sufficient skills for possible entry into the fields upon graduation.

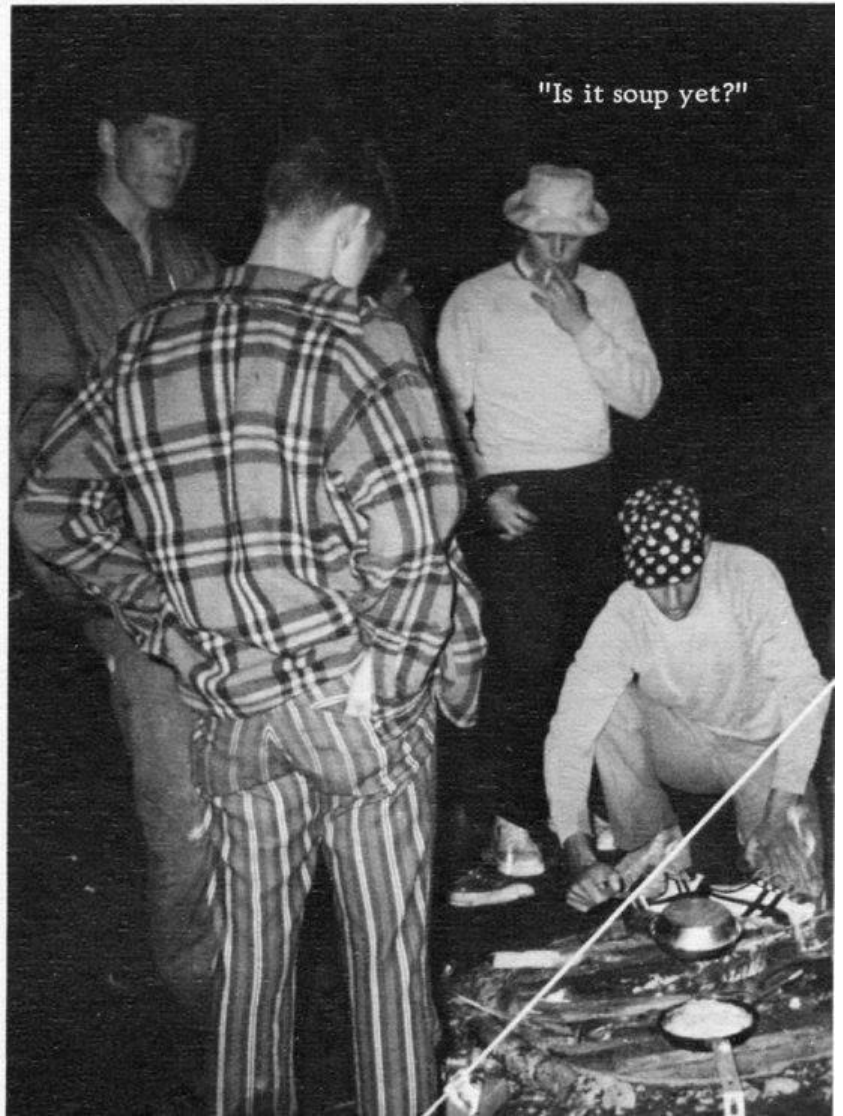
