To the Class of 1975 in general, on behalf of the Board of Directors, and I am certain all of your parents, we sincerely wish you the very best in all of your future endeavors.

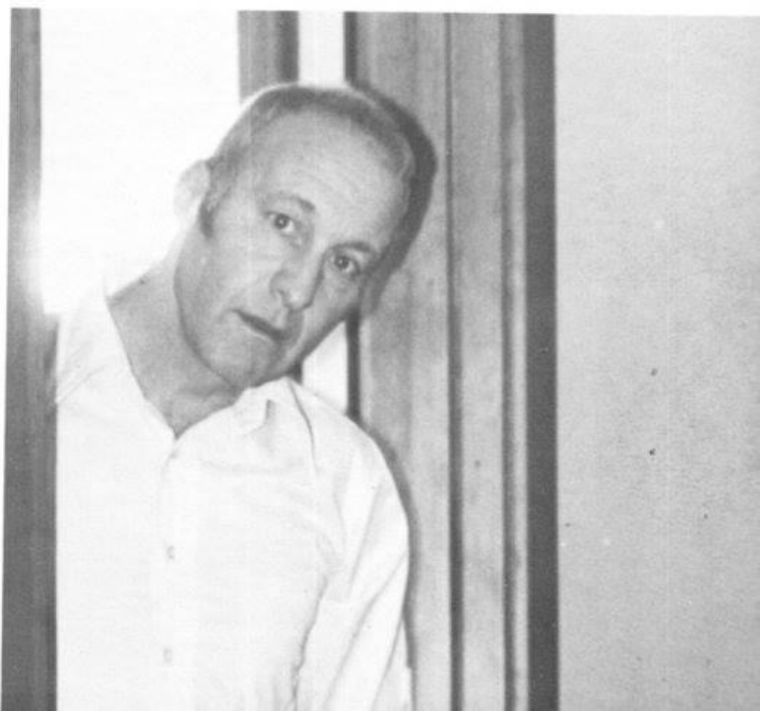
